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## **Introduction to Handicaps – by Chris Clarke, Club Handicap Secretary**

Welcome to Stock Brook. If you are joining us from another club and already hold an official handicap, then you will likely be familiar with handicapping and mostly interested in the paragraph 2 below which explains the process for you to transfer your handicap to Stock Brook.

It is, however, very possible you are joining the golf section as someone new to the game. I set out below a very brief introduction to handicapping as my main aim here is to encourage you to take the necessary steps to secure an official handicap at the club. This allows you (as well as those transferring with a handicap) to actively participate in club competitions and other golf events, such as Club Night. As you play more and more rounds, you will build up a proper record of your progress and, hopefully, see measureable improvement based on the data you will be able to access in the various systems available to you!

Those of you coming to Stock Brook with a handicap will already be aware that, in November 2020, we saw a major change in the way handicaps are calculated and we now operate under the World Handicap System. This still relatively new approach has 2 key aims – to have a single global handicapping system and, secondly, to adjust the handicap a player receives based on the difficulty of the course played, not just their playing ability. So in practice, we now see a variation in our handicaps from course to course and also depending on the Tee used. Under the WHS rules, the number that represents your ability on a course is known as your Handicap Index. This assessment of your playing ability is established initially on completion of 54 holes of golf. It is steadily fine-tuned as you play each subsequent round of golf until you have submitted 20 'qualifying' scores. Your Handicap Index is then based on the best 8 scores and is then maintained on a rolling basis. That is, as you play further rounds the most historic score of the past 20 drops out of the calculation.

These 'qualifying' scores are entered into the system through your participation in club competitions or by arranging your own 'General Play' rounds. These rounds were previously referred to as casual or recreational rounds but these terms, while now out-of-date, are also misleading. General Play rounds must be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf and competition rules. Scorecards must be properly filled in and rounds completed and scores submitted, except for certain exceptional circumstances. These scores are recorded and closely checked in the WHS system. More information on General Rounds will be supplied as and when you are notified of your handicap.

If it seems complicated, that is because it is! However, the complexity is in the detail – in reality the various supporting systems/Apps take care of everything for the player. Clubs are also required to display information on the ratings for their course/tees and therefore, overall, the player does not have to be too concerned about all the detail.

More information on the various Apps available to you is contained in the Introduction to Competitions which follows as well as the final section to this booklet. Also, further and more detailed information regarding handicaps and related matters can be found on the Members website using the following link:

You may also wish to look at the WHS website itself which contains a large amount of additional information.

There are 2 ways to obtain a Handicap Index (HI) at Stock Brook:

### **1. Obtaining a HI for the first time**

If you have not held a handicap before or it has been over 12 months since leaving the last club, you will need to submit between 3 and 6 scorecards (totalling at least 54 holes) for rounds played at Stock Brook. The cards must be clearly marked 'For Handicap Index' and should each be for 9 or 18 holes on any of the Stock Brook Manor course combinations. Please clearly indicate the date of the round/s, tee used, your name the marker's name and signatures. The marker should be a member with an existing handicap.

This initial 'batch' of scorecards should be placed in the left-hand slot on top of the desk located immediately under the computer terminal (Competitions Screen), in the ground floor lobby/stairwell area between the golf reception and door into the bar/clubhouse. Please also attach a note with the following essential information:

- Your name
- Date of Birth
- Email address
- Mobile telephone number
- 5 or 7 day membership status
- Confirmation of Tee/s used on each scorecard

The Handicap Secretary will enter these initial scores into the WHS and Club V1 systems and you will then be notified of your WHS Membership Number (known as a CDH Number) and your initial handicap. Once you have a CDH Number, you will be able to log in and access both of these systems. You will also be responsible for entering subsequent competition or General Play scores (previously called Casual Play scores/rounds) in the system.

Your handicap will be further refined once you start playing in qualifying competitions. Alternatively, you can submit scorecards for General Play rounds) – once you have a CDH Number and official handicap, however, your actual scorecard still needs to be put in the same desk drawer as mentioned above.

### **2. Transferring your HI from another Club**

If you were previously a member of another club and therefore hold an official HI, then the procedure is simpler as you do not need to submit initial scorecards covering the 54 holes mentioned above. Assuming you have an existing CDH Number, then please provide the name of your previous club together with your CDH Number (if known) and the personal information listed in the bullet points above. You can do this using the Golfing History pro forma supplied to you with this welcome booklet and putting the same desk drawer as described above. If you are a member of more than one club, then you must nominate a Home Club, to ensure you only have one CDH Number and Handicap Index.

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## **Introduction to Competitions – by Phil Watson, Club Competition Secretary**

Welcome to the Club where we hope you will get to know, play golf and make friends with many of your fellow members. Undoubtedly one of the best ways to achieve this is to take part in the numerous competitions which will be open to you and which we encourage you to enter.

### **Overview**

Across the 3 sections of the club; Men, Ladies and Seniors, we run many competitions throughout the year, these include; singles, pairs and team competitions and cover a wide variety of formats, including; Strokeplay, Stableford, Matchplay, Foursomes, Greensomes and Texas Scrambles. Don't be put off by the different formats, if you enter a competition the rules will be explained when entering and will soon become familiar to you.

Each section is responsible for the running of their own competitions and all competitions are laid out in a club calendar for the year.

### **Entering Competitions**

All the Main Club competitions are open for booking to members at least 2 weeks in advance of the competition date. Details for each competition can be found in a number of ways, via Club V1 Members Hub, club PSI (computer terminal in the clubhouse) and at [www.howdido.com](http://www.howdido.com). Many members find the HowDidIDo (HDID) App as the best method for keeping up to speed with competitions which will be available to you once you have an Active Handicap, after which you will be able to register.

Whichever method you use to access the competition, you will be able to find full details about the competition including; the format, entry conditions, the entry fee and the tee the competition will be played from. Book yourself into the competition via Club V1 Members Hub, HowDidIDo or the club PSI. Any fee will be taken from your ClubV1 Account at the time of booking, so please ensure that you have sufficient funds available when making a booking.

### **Trophy and Honours Board Competitions**

There are a number of competitions throughout the year for which there is a trophy, some of which also have an Honours Board in the Clubhouse.

For these competitions, including knockout competitions, a draw takes place which will determine your tee-time and who you will be playing with or against. The draw is posted on ClubV1, HowDidIDo and on the PSI terminal and for some competitions emailed to all competitors.

On the day of the competition, a member of the Competition Committee will be in the Clubhouse to register and answer any questions that you may have. You will also be expected to Sign-In to the competition online prior to your round. Please also be at the first tee at least 10 minutes prior to your designated tee-time to ensure all entrants tee-off at the designated time.

Upon completion, enter your score on either HowDidIDo or the PSI terminal and ensure your card is signed by your playing partner and placed in the card drawer in the clubhouse.

### **Men's Monthly Medals, Monthly Stablefords and Midweek Medals**

What might be regarded as the staple constituent of all golf clubs' programmes, these competitions are held every month throughout the year, weather permitting.

At Stock Brook, we usually have the following every month

- Monthly Strokeplay Medal, usually on a Saturday around the start of the month
- Monthly Midweek Strokeplay Medal, on a Monday within the first 2 weeks of the month
- Monthly Stableford, played on a Saturday in the second half of the month
- Monthly Sunday Stableford, played around the middle of the month

You can enter as many or as few of these competitions as you wish. There is no handicap restriction, however, players with Inactive handicaps can enter, but cannot win - this provides those players an ideal route to achieving a Competition Handicap.

The club reserves a number of tee times for these competitions, usually between 7.30am and 10.00am, which you can book on HowDidIDo or ClubV1. Your entry fee will also be taken at the time of booking.

For these competitions, you are not restricted to playing in the reserved time, you can play at any time on the day of the competition. Simply enter the competition on ClubV1 or HDID on the day and ensure you sign-in to the competition prior to commencing your round. In these situations, you will need to ensure you are accompanied by another member with an Active Handicap to mark and sign your card.

### **Golfer Of The Year**

Each section of the club runs a Golfer Of The Year Competition, which is awarded to the golfer who has performed the most consistently across certain competitions throughout the season. For the Men's section, this covers 8 competitions and the individual men's knockouts. To be eligible for the Golfer of The Year and the competitions that contribute towards the points, you will require to have at least 7 qualifying scores on your handicap record in the 12 months prior to the closing date for entries.

### **Trophies and Medals**

In October every year we have a Presentation Day which commences with a Mixed Texas Scramble followed by a meal and presentation of trophies and prizes to those members who have been fortunate enough to win any of the associated competitions. Together with Captain's Day and Captain's Drive-In these rank as highlights of the year's sociable events, with usually over 100 members from all sections taking part in the golf competition and more joining in the post-match celebrations. These days are not to be missed, particularly if you wish to get to know fellow members.

### **Team Inter-club Competitions**

Stock Brook field teams in the following men's competitions:

Thornton Cup – Essex Golf Union competition is played off scratch, but typically the Team would have HI's below 6.0.

Leslie Wood – Essex Golf Union competition for HI's of 6.0 and above (typically 6.0 – 10).

Norman Plum – Essex Golf Union competition for HI's 11.0 to 24.0.

Jubilee Cup – Essex competition for HI's 10.5 to 20.0

We also enter a number of competitions in the Ladies and Seniors Sections, details of which are available from the relevant Competition Secretary.

I'm always happy to have a chat or run through all of the above with you while you settle in at the club.

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## How we use Members' funds – by Graham Page, Club Treasurer

As a Stock Brook golf club member, you will pay an entry fee to play in each club competition. These competition fees make up the majority of the income that we receive, which is then used to pay for three main activities:

- The support of our club teams and representatives in the Mens, Ladies, Seniors and Junior sections, in County and National competitions;
- Awards for club competition winners, along with the maintenance and engraving of the trophies which are awarded on Presentation Day at the end of the season;
- Social functions which are held several times during the year. These have included a quiz night and a games evening in the past, and the Members Funds provide a heavily discounted, and sometimes free entry for members to these popular events.

All expenses that are paid from the Members Funds are agreed by the Main Committee, and accounted for by myself. Each section has their own social fund, which they manage themselves, but these are consolidated into the main accounts.

I prepare monthly accounts which are reviewed by the Committee and included as part of the Committee meeting minutes, which are available for all members to see. I also complete a set of audited accounts at the end of the financial year, which are presented at the Annual General Meeting.

Tee time booking is done either directly at golf reception, by phone on 01277 658181 or through the Elite Live App (download for free from your App store). You will need a personal log on code which can be obtained by contacting [Proshop@stockbrook.com](mailto:Proshop@stockbrook.com) who will check your email and allocate you a log on and email you with instructions of what to do. You will be able to book either 5 or 7 days in advance, depending on your golf membership.

## Club V1 Members Hub, HowDidiDo, England Golf & Club Competitions

We run many competitions which can be entered (once you have a handicap) by using the software HowDidiDo (HDID) and Club V1 Members Hub. Both of these exist as applications that are accessible on your mobile phone (download the app from your App Store free of charge) or from a desktop PC using the link <https://stockbrook.hub.clubv1.com/> . In order to register, you must be on Club V1 Members Hub so will need to speak to the Handicap Secretary at [SBMHandicaps@gmail.com](mailto:SBMHandicaps@gmail.com) to ensure you are recorded on our system.

Payment for competition fees is made from a Competition Account held on Club V1 Members Hub which you will need to fund using a debit or credit card - see instructions on back page.

We hold weekend Medals & Stablefords competitions (3) each month. You need to book using HDID/Club V1 Members Hub - with the entry fee (currently £3) payable on booking from your competition account. The format of these competitions is 'start sheet' meaning you choose your tee time, your group or add yourself to a group. Competition details can be found by using the "i" icon for information in HowDidiDo.

Men's majors & mixed competitions are 'drawn' competitions - add yourself to the list (providing you meet the qualification criteria) and you will be added into the draw. We have starters and the draw sheet is sent to entrants prior to the competition. Entry fee

is paid on booking using HowDidiDo/Club V1 Members Hub.

The MyEG (England Golf) app can be downloaded from your App Store and used to check your handicap and record casual rounds.

## Club Night

On a Thursday evening (4:15 – 6:15 start), during the summer months, we run a Club Night Social for **all members**. This is a roll-up competition over 9-holes and is an opportunity to meet others and play golf in a relaxed way – followed by food and a half-priced drink at the bar! A great place to meet new golfers.

## Seniors Section – over 55

If you are over 55, you are eligible to join our very active Seniors Section. They run competitions in both 18 and 9-hole format every Wednesday morning throughout the year. ## Creating & topping up a Competition Account balance



### Club V1 Members Hub

The Club V1 Members Hub can be downloaded (free of charge) from your App Store for mobile phone or tablet – or accessed via your browser on PC or laptop at: <https://stockbrook.hub.clubv1.com>

Once logged in to **Club V1 Members Hub** – you will see that there are many features that you recognise from the HowDidiDo app. You will find at the bottom, the Competition Balance – this shows you the balance that you have available for booking onto competitions and the transactions that have taken place on your account. **It also is the area to add funds to your competition account. Adding funds:**

- By clicking Competitions Balance button, will take you through to your transactions and a 'Top Up' button
- The Top Up button will take you through to the Stock Brook Golf Club 'HowDoiPay' section where you will be able to choose the amount you wish to top up using a debit or credit card. Select the amount you wish to add, then under Payment Methods click the 'Pay Using Card (OB Payments)'. Recommended amount £30.
- Either enter or confirm your address on the next page
- Enter the card details (either Visa, Mastercard or Maestro) that you wish to use. There is an option to 'save card details'. This will mean that for future payments all you will need to do is enter your 3-digit CVV number to confirm payment. *This is an option – you can enter your card details each time you top up if you prefer not leave them on the system.*
- Finally – make payment by using the PAY button
